



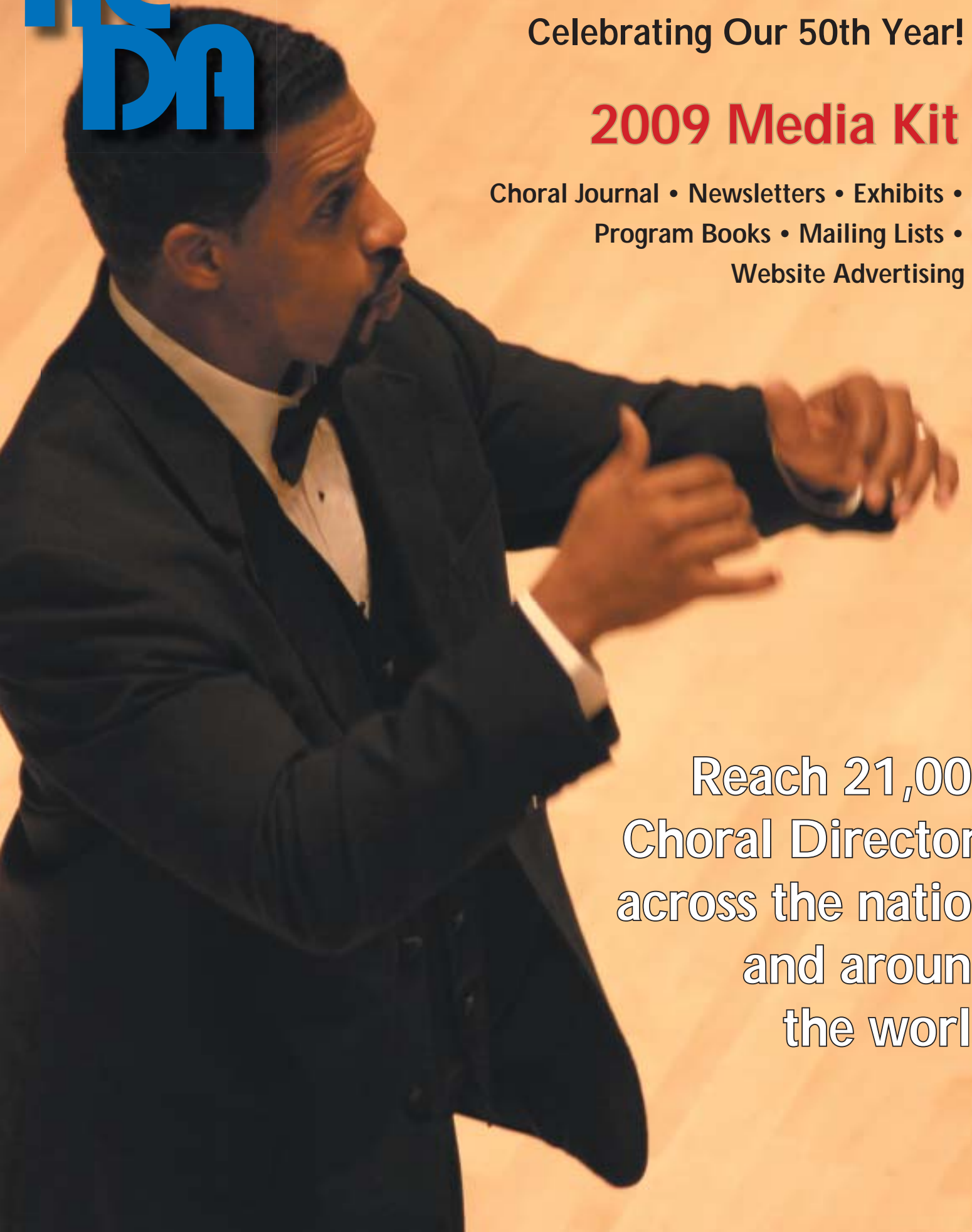

ACDA Advocacy Resolution

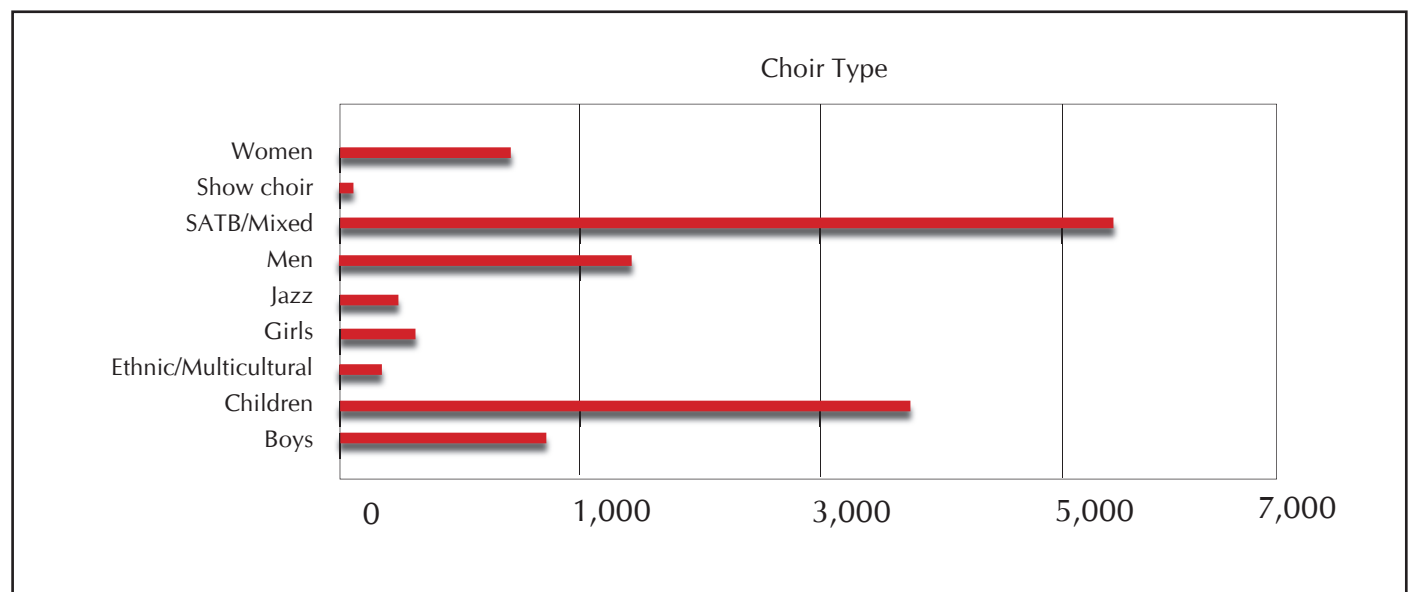
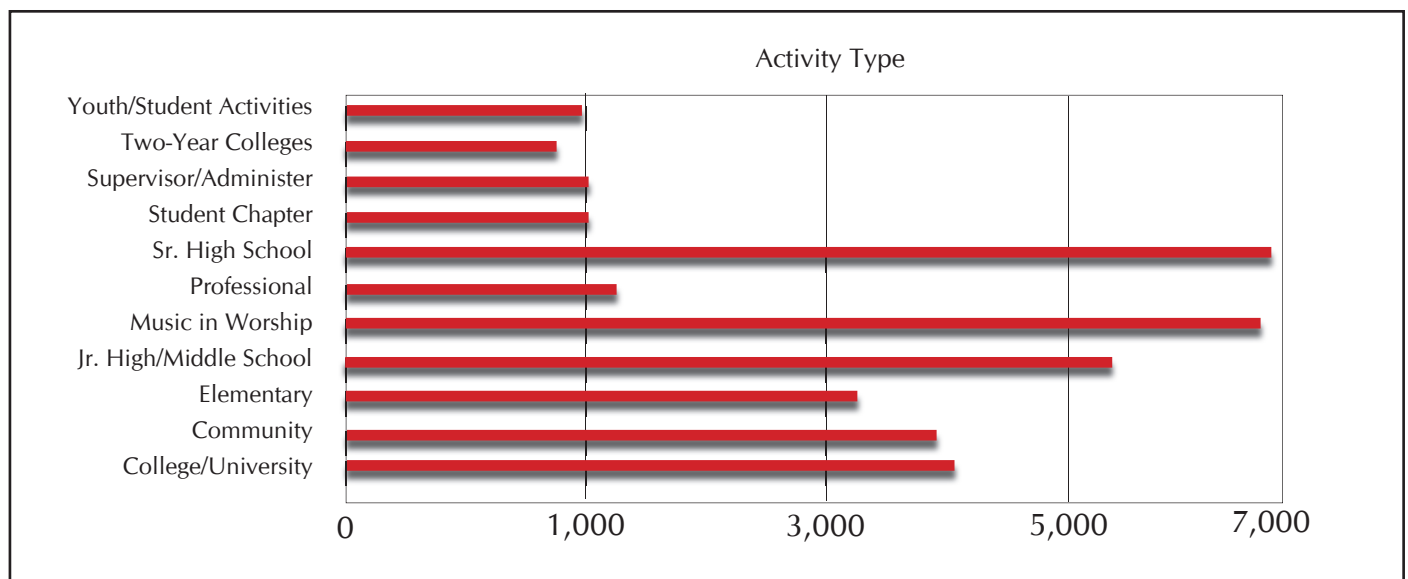
Whereas, the human spirit is elevated to a broader understanding of itself through the study and performance in the aesthetic arts, and

Whereas, serious cutbacks in funding and support have steadily eroded state institutions and their programs throughout our country,

Be it resolved that all citizens of the United States actively voice their affirmative and collective support for necessary funding at the local, state, and national levels of education and government, to ensure the survival of arts programs.

Members

ACDA has a membership list of over 21,000 choral directors who represent more than one million singers across the United States. When filling out a membership application members indicate their primary activity and choir types. Some members may be involved in more than one area.



The *Choral Journal* is the official publication of \ACDA and is mailed out monthly to all current members and library subscribers in 43 different countries. The magazine subscription is a benefit of ACDA membership.

The volume year is August through June/July. It is mailed out approximately two weeks before the issue month.

Feature Articles

Each issue has three feature articles that cover various topics including

- Rehearsal techniques, style and interpretation, choral conducting
- Composers of choral music
- Educational techniques and philosophies
- Varying forms of choral music (motets, masses, part songs, etc.)
- History of choral performance and choral organizations
- Biographies of conductors
- Vocal pedagogy

Regular Content

- Columns written by the Executive Director, the President, and the Editor.
- *Compact Disc Reviews* examines new choral CD recordings produced by large and small record labels.
- *Book Reviews* takes a look at current textbooks, music histories, biographies, and how-to books within the choral industry.
- *Choral Reviews* evaluates the full spectrum of printed music made available to choral directors by the music publishers.
- *Hallelujah!* explores the role of choral music in the worship settings of diverse faith communities.
- *On the Voice* investigates current research trends in vocal health science, pedagogy and performance, choral rehearsal techniques, and performance practices.
- *Student Times* features articles relevant to collegiate members and student chapters written by students.
- *Children's Choirs* provides ideas on choral literature, rehearsal techniques, vocal methods, and philosophy relating to young treble choirs while seeking to address the needs of both school and community children's choirs.
- *Choral Music in the Junior High/Middle School* is designed to be a forum for sharing ideas and stimulating thoughts that help choir directors for grades 5-9 to be more effective.
- Other regular content includes letters to the editor and *Career Moves* (index of open position ads in each month's issue).

Focus Issues

For several issues throughout the year, a specific topic is covered: travel, vocal health, specific level or type of choir, sacred music, composers or conductors, etc. Content is selectively chosen to maintain the theme through the entire issue.

The January issue highlights upcoming convention information: biographies on choirs and their conductors, convention schedules, and interest session descriptions.

The March issue contains a free summer festival and workshop listing.

The May issue is the post convention issue with coverage and photos of the events.
